FIRE BAN REMAINS IN EFFECT

Even with the precipation received over the weekend, the fire danger rating has not improved enough to lift the Fire Ban. Hot and dry conditions are forecasted for the rest of the week, and as such a Fire Ban remains in effect with respect to all open fires within our municipal boundaries. If a fire ignites in these conditions, it has the potential to spread very quickly.

Under the Fire Ban, all active fire/burn permits are cancelled, and no new permits will be issued until conditions warrant. Burning of any kind is prohibited, including recreational fires (campfires, backyard fire pits and outdoor fireplaces), burning in a burn barrel or incinerator, charcoal briquette BBQs, yard debris, etc. Fireworks and exploding targets are also prohibited.

Propane or natural gas appliances (i.e., barbeques, stoves, heaters and portable firepits), for the purpose of heating or cooking are allowed, but must be CSA approved or UL certified.

Burning or lighting a fire during a Fire Ban is illegal, and fines or cost of response could apply.
