The month of May brings warmer weather and Albertans are eager to enjoy the outdoors. At this time of the year, the Office of the Fire Commissioner is reminding Albertans of the importance of fire safety when camping and heading outdoors. Here are some important tips to keep your camping and outdoor adventures fire safe:

Campfires

Before starting a campfire, check to see if your community has a fire ban in place at albertafirebans.ca.

Always practice campfire safety.

- If required, get a permit. Always follow the rules, as outlined in your permit.
- Respect fire bans.
- Closely supervise all outdoor fires. Make sure the fire fully extinguished and out, before leaving.
- Supervise children around any fire outdoors, including campfires, fire pits, chimneys, and outdoor fireplaces.
- Permitted recreational fires such as campfires need to be at least 25 feet (8 meters) away from anything that can burn.





Rural Property Safety Tips

As the warmer weather is upon us, many creatures will be coming out of hibernation, including thieves. Here are some tips for you to do your best to protect your home from criminals...

- Keep your home, garages and vehicles locked at all times.
- Secure sliding windows and doors. Install 1" deadbolts.
- Remove all valuables (including pocket change) from parked vehicles. If valuables are seen by thieves they will be stolen.
- Use motion sensor lights for the exterior of your home.
- If you will be away from your home for a period of time, have someone you trust check it periodically. Use timers on interior lights. Do not share vacation plans on social media to alert people that you are away. You can post your vacation pictures when you get home.
- Consider installing camera surveillance, an intrusion alarm or an alarm to notify you when someone pulls into your driveway.
- Report suspicious people and or vehicles to the police in a timely fashion. *Know your rural address*.
- **BE NEIGHBORLY** get to know your neighbors and look out for one another. You can keep each other informed about any suspicious activity in your area.

Safe Roads

Motorcycles are back on the roads and are sometimes not as visible as a vehicle. Watch out for them and if you are a rider, be mindful of your surroundings as well. Enjoy your ride safely.

Recreational Vehicles have wide turning patterns and may have to swing into another lane to round a corner. If you are towing a trailer with your RV, make sure the hitch is suitable for the trailer's weight and is fitted with approved safety chains or cables. RV's are heavy and take longer to stop and are more difficult to steer around other vehicles or in a windstorm.

School Buses will display red flashing lights when children are getting on or off the bus. They could be crossing the road in the process. If you encounter a school bus with red flashing lights, STOP! Do not proceed until the bus driver has de-activated the red flashing lights.

Slow moving **farm equipment** will be on the roads for spring cultivating, seeding, and fertilizing and will be putting in some long days. Make sure lights on equipment are functioning and visible.

ROAD BANS



With the warmer weather conditions and as the frost comes out of the ground ROAD BANS are in effect. When the frost comes out, the roads get very soft, especially on the shoulders, and our roads are left in a vulnerable state. The MD of Willow Creek puts the road bans on to minimize the amount of damage done to our roads.

When the posted road bans are in effect, the Community Peace Officers will be patrolling the roads for overweight trucks. If caught with an overloaded truck on a banned road the fines can be very expensive, so please keep your loads under the weight restrictions put in place.


